

TAGGART ROAD

Taggart Road was probably named after Will Taggart who lived in a home near 280 Taggart Road, in the 1800s, which has disappeared. He married Mary Hodges and had several children. On the 1938 map Taggart Road is shown as being only a short portion of Barnes Hill Road where it meets Taggart today. The rest of Taggart is shown as Ruuspakka Road in 1938.

There are several foundations on the property: (1) Solomon Millage (died October 27, 1869) and married to Cathy (died May 19, 1882). Son John H. Millage died at 26 years old on March 8, 1871 and buried in Cutter Cemetery. (2) Davis Brooks, who was married to Analiza Alexander who died on September 12, 1892. Buried in Cutter Cemetery. (3) F. Collins. (4) G. Cook.
448	Taggart Road		Moses McCorn, Dick Matson, Carol and Bernie Cook	At Corner of Taggart and Cornish Hollow. A new log home has been built on the lot. Moses McCorn lived here in 1866. Dick Matson lived here in the 1960s.
